

## **Early Learning & Support**

Online and in person resources and referrals help parents find the right child care and development options for their unique family needs. There are supports in place to encourage families to develop their own child care plan, to gain positive parenting skills through workshops, trainings, and in-depth conversations with other caregivers through friendly and approachable learning environments.

For 20+ years, CCRC has been providing high quality early learning and preschool experiences for three-and four-year-old children across the San Fernando Valley. In 2009, our award-winning Head Start program also began offering Early Head Start services for children 0-3. And, in 2014, we partnered with the Palmdale School District to provide Head Start and Early Head Start services across the Antelope Valley.

CCRC offers a variety of coaching and apprenticeship programs that to meet the needs of the diverse communities we serve. Quality Start programs, in Los Angeles and San Bernardino counties, empower early learning professionals to build and improve the quality of care they provide to children birth to five. Child care providers are offered the opportunity to learn what quality care in different settings looks like, and also benefit from numerous offerings through hundreds of community cohorts, trainings, and workshops every year.

# **Cultivating Financial Stability**

CCRC administers a number of different state and federally funded programs that help families pay for the child care of children from birth through 12 years of age, and older children with exceptional needs. Programs may offer an educational component, meals and snacks, parent education, referrals to health and social services for families, and staff development opportunities to employees. CCRC supports the growth and professional development of the child care workforce through coaching programs, apprenticeship programs, and trainings. These programs offer opportunities to meet licensing and credentialing requirements, improve business practices, earn teacher permits and set a pathway to attain college degrees.

# Mental Health & Well-Being

We administer a variety of programs with the goal to help families and child care providers remove barriers to their emotional, social, and physical health. CCRC's certified home visitors spend time within a family's home helping to identify milestones, and partner with families to attain self-identified goals.

Specialized small group peer learning offers conversations around specific, and sometimes difficult, subject matter facilitated in a positive and supportive environment. Parents and caregivers acquire knowledge of child and self-care, and bond with other community members in a relatable way.

Early developmental milestone screenings are offered for families and offer guidance to measure how a child might learn, speak, move, and relate to others. Families benefit from resources and services to support positive child and family outcomes.

## **Research & Policy**

cCRC actively engages in research and advocacy efforts that directly impact the well-being of California children, families, and the early care and learning workforce. We develop meaningful relationships with lawmakers, coalitions, and community partners, bringing them an awareness of the challenges faced by those we serve. We work collaboratively across the state to research, problem solve, and communicate barriers and solutions through ongoing program work, visits to legislative offices, convenings, and our annual Policy Forum.

## **Community Outreach & Resources**

The agency hosts a wide variety of large-scale community and family events throughout the year. Our Family Play Day events and monthly supply distributions offer opportunities to learn through play, access to vital resources and information, and concrete support in multiple forms including books, cleaning supplies, developmentally specific learning tools and supports, and fresh fruits and vegetables.

We collect and distribute books, school supplies, toys, and other critically needed items throughout the year. We work closely with individual donors, businesses, and community partners to ensure we have access to diapers, wipes, personal care items, baby formula and other essentials, cleaning supplies, etc. when families need them.
